Fishery Statistics and other outstanding issues

The NAFO statistical database is at the NAFO Secretariat and available in computer diskette form or hard copies to the Contracting Parties.

Noting data reports are due on 15 May, for the preceding year of fishing, STATLANT 21A reports (preliminary annual catches in the NAFO Convention Area by species and divisions), have not been received from: for 1994 - Korea, Lithuania (partial) and USA (partial); for 1995 - Denmark (Faroes), Estonia, Lithuania, and USA; for 1996 - Denmark (Faroes), Estonia, EU-Denmark, Korea, Lithuania, Poland and USA.

Noting data reports are due on 30 June, for the preceding year of fishing, STATLANT 21B reports (final annual catches in the NAFO Convention Area by species, month, effort), have not been received from: for 1989 - EU-France (M); for 1993 - Denmark (Faroes) and USA; for 1994 - Denmark (Faroes), Korea, Lithuania and USA; for 1995 - Estonia, Denmark (Faroes), Lithuania and USA. For 1996, STATLANT 21B reports have only been received from Cuba, EU-Germany, EU-Ireland, France (M), France (SP), Iceland, Japan, Latvia and Russia.

Major NAFO substantive issues and decisions through 1995

- New members of the Fisheries Commission France (in respect of St. Pierre et Miquelon) and United States of America; total membership -15 Contracting Parties.
- Modification of the boundaries of the NAFO statistical division, Div. 3P.
- Endorsement of the UN Resolutions 50/24 and 50/25 December 1995 re the UN Agreement on Straddling and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks; and on large-scale pelagic driftnet fishing.
- Dispatch diplomatic demarches to non-Contracting Parties fishing in the Regulatory Area Belize, Honduras, Panama and Sierra Leone.
- Two intersessional STACFAC Meetings (at NAFO Headquarters and Brussels).
- b) The Fisheries Commission:

- Amendment of the Conservation and Enforcement Measures: discard/retention rule; experimental 90mm redlish fishery; shrimp 3M effort limitation; report "target species", management of 2J3KL Cod fishery is resumed.
- Adoption of the following TACs for regulated stocks in the Regulatory Area for 1997: Cod in Div. 3M-6000t; Redfish in Div. 3M-26000t; Redfish in Div. 3LN-11000t; Squid in Subareas 3+4-150000t; Greenland halibut 3LMNO-20,000t;
- "No directed fishing" for the following stocks: Cod in Div. 3NO, A. plaice in Div. 3M and 3LNO, Yellowtail flounder in Div. 3LNO, Witch flounder in Div. 3NO, Capelin in Div. 3NO, and Cod in Div. 3L of the Regulatory Area.
- Regulate shrimp fishing in Div. 3M (bar space 22 mm, by catch 5%, minimum mesh size 40 mm), and "no directed fishing" in 3LNO.

 - On stock assessments, the summaries and conclusions for each stock formulated in NAFO SCS Doc. 97/14, Section IX.1a) and consideration was given to precautionary measures and criteria for reopening fisheries, Section IX.1b).
 - On summaries and conclusion for stocks as requested by Coastal States.
 - On overview of environmental conditions in the NAFO area in 1996.
 - Analyses of distribution and abundance of non-traditional species recorded in the extensive survey databases be presented to the Scientific Council in June 1998;
 - On fishery statistics and inter-agency harmonization of data, the Assistant Executive Secretary should attend the intersessional meeting of CWP in Rome, Italy.
 - The importance of timely submission of STATLANT statistical data for the work of the Scientific Council.
 - For the scientific and statistical information dissemination, the establishment and operation of a website at NAFO Secretariat.
 - The examination of current fishing effort definitions.
 - The Journal publication should accept colour graphic presentations.

A 2.0% Cost of Living Adjustment was budgeted for 1997, although, no COLA increases have been received to date within the Canadian Government.

The 1997 budget provided for a 3% increase in employer's contributions, while the actual premiums decreased by 10%.

This figure is interdependent on salary levels (see note a).

A series of cost cutting measures were introduced to reduce communication costs which included: (1) reducing the mailing distribution list of circular letters; (2) eliminating the duplication of faxing and then mailing letters, where possible; and (3) eliminating the duplication of faxing hail reports.

Note 1: This amount represents amounts due from Cuba (1997-\$15,576.06; 1996-\$17,210.13); Republic of Korea (\$15,002.74); Lithuania (\$15,620.38) and Poland (15,002.75). Applied against accounts receivable for 1997 Allowance for Doubtful Accounts has been Bulgaria (\$15,317.08) and Romania (\$15,317.09).

Note 2: Termination Benefit Funds have been invested into Redeemable Guaranteed Investment Certificates with the Bank of Nova Scotia. The investments are for a one year term, maturing June 26, 1998, with an interest rate of 3.25%.

Note 3: At the annual meeting in September, 1991, the General Council approved in the Staff Rules an enhanced employee termination benefit package to be effective January 1, 1992. At December 31, 1997 the additional liability resulting from this enhancement will amount to approximately \$80,300, which amount has not been recorded in the accounts of the Organization.

The Organization is funding this liability at the rate of \$10,000 per annum as approved by the General Council (18th Annual Meeting, September, 1996).

 - b) unexpended balances at the end of the 12-month period specified in Rule 3.2 for prior year obligations, but not disbursed;
 - c) refunds, from any source, of prior year's expenditures of the Organization.
 - Rule 4.3 Monies in the accumulated surplus account may be used temporarily to the extent necessary to finance appropriations pending receipt of annual payments by Contracting Parties.
