ANNUAL MEETING - JUNE 1979

Canadian request for action by the Commission, pursuant to Article XIII of the Convention, with respect to the operations of Non-Member Countries in the ICNAF Area beyond national fisheries jurisdiction

At the 1978 Annual Meeting, information was presented to the Commission with respect to the presence of vessels of non-Member Countries, namely Panama and Venezuela, fishing in the ICNAF Area beyond national fisheries jurisdiction. Details of these vessels were provided in Appendices I and II of ICNAF Com. Doc. 78/VI/15. The Commission resolved that the Chairman be instructed to inform the Governments of both countries of the Commission's objectives and regulations pertaining to the area and called upon Member States to invite the attention of the Governments of Panama and Venezuela to the importance of ensuring that fisheries in the area are conducted in conformity with the Commission's Management Regime, etc.

Surveillance observations to date in 1979 indicate that the problem continues, since vessels of Panama and Venezuela along with an additional entrant, Mexico, have operated in the area at various times during the current year. Canada again wishes to draw to the attention of Members the possible serious consequences of the continuation and possible expansion of the operations of non-Member States in the area and requests the Commission to consider appropriate measures to deal with the problem.

Such details as are available concerning the operations of the non-Member vessels are presented in Appendices I, II, and III.

During the boarding, it was learned that this pair had been fishing on Flemish Cap and Tail of the Grand Bank from 2 February 1979 to the date of boarding, 27 April. The catch of the pair was estimated at 1,000 tons round weight. The inspector was informed that the catch was to be landed in Spain or Portugal.

Information on two additional vessels

Canadian Inspectors have obtained information that two other vessels of Venezuelan registry have been fishing on the Flemish Cap in Division 3M during 5-8 May 1979. The vessels (Bacanova and Pesca Gel) were pair-trawling and were forced to discontinue operations due to generator trouble on Bacanova. The two vessels proceeded to St. Pierre for repairs. The Bacanova later proceeded to St. John's, Newfoundland (arriving 31 May), to have repairs completed while Pesca Gel remained in St. Pierre. The Inspector was informed that the two vessels planned to fish on Flemish Cap and Tail of Grand Bank for the next 4-5 months. The Inspector observed that the Bacanova had 0.72 metric tons of salted cod on board and was informed that the Pesca Gel had about one metric ton on board. The carrying capacity of each vessel was reported to the Inspector at 225 metric tons of salted cod. Both ships have Korean crews, who indicated that this was their first experience fishing in the North Atlantic.
