Amendment to Dantsh Fesearch Keport 1953
(Document No. 16)

On 25 May 1954 the Secretariat received from Grønlands Fiskeriundersøgelser a revised text for that part of the Danish Research report which deals with cod taggings in Greenland waters.

This revision was prepared in order to make it possible to consider a series of recaptures reported after the research report had been forwarded.

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Owing to the late date of receipt it has not been possible to change the text of the original report, and those having received that report are therefore asked to consider the following os a substitute to the text in the original report under item 4 from page 4, 22 lire from above "A total of 50 cod" to page 5 , 8 line from above "the rich year-classes 1942 and 1945 ".
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A total of 52 of the cod tagged in 1953 were recaptured in the same year. Nearly all were recaptured near the place of the tagging. Only in three cases were recaptures taken in some distance from the tagging locality, namely, one recaptured on Store Hellefiske Bank, which was tagged on Lille Hellefiske Bank, and two tagged in Ameralik Fjord, recaptured later on Fylla Bank and on Store Hellefiske Bank respectively.


Considering the large mumbr of cod which have been tagged at Greenland in the latest years the rimber of recaptures at Iceland has not been very high in 1953. They cannot approximately enter in comparison with the numbers from the years before the war where in 1933, 1934, 1938 and 1939 the corresponding percentages of recaptures from Iceland amounted to respectively $73.1,67.1$, 48.8 and $51.2 \%$.

Anong the recaptures from Iceland, 17 have been tagged in Julianehab district, 1 in Frederiksháb district, 1 in Ameralik Fjord, 1 in Sukkertoppen district, 2 in Disko Bay, 3 on Fylla Bank and 1 on Lille Hellefiske Bank.

It is seen that like in previous years the largest numbers of recaptures from Iceland originate from taggings in Julianehab district.

Otoliths have been taken from twentytwo of the cod recaptured in Icelandic waters. The age analyses gave the following results:

It appears from the table that the largest numbers of recaptures from Iceland belong to the two rich year classes 1942 and 1945.
